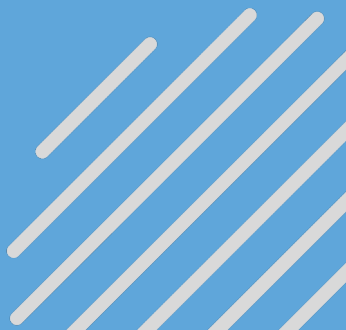
The Vibrant Capital

Phuket

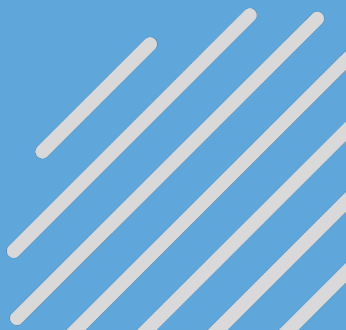
The Pearl of the Andaman
